IMPORTANT NOTES FOR COMPETITORS

- 1. Public liability Insurance **MUST** be held by **ALL** competitors with the declaration on the entry form clearly signed.
- 3. A ploughing entry entitles only one vehicle on site free of charge
- 4. All competitors must report to the Registration/Checking-In Area (NOT the Secretary's Tent) by 9.00 a.m; after which they must pick up their lunch.
- 5. Starting and finishing times should be carefully noted as indicated in the Schedule.
- 6. This year we have been designated as a Qualifying Match for certain classes at the British

National Championships in 2019:

The winner and second placed entry in Class 3.

The winner of Class 5 or the winner of Class 7 or the highest placed Y.F.C. member in

Classes 5,7 or 8.

The winners of Class 6A, 10, 12 and 14.

Competitors in Classes 1, 2 and 4 do not need to qualify.

Note ploughs ineligible for Classes 6, 6a, 9, 12 and 13.

- 7. All Trophy Winners upon receiving an award, the recipient must sign for it and leave a deposit of £10. This will be refunded upon return of the trophy, which should be made by the end of June the following year.
- 8. **Late entries will not be accepted.** Telephone entries will not be accepted.
- 9. Competitors who have qualified to enter the National Ploughing Match in their class (ie Class 3, 4, 5, 6A, 7, 10, 12 & 14) will qualify for £100 towards travelling expenses provided they take part in next year's National Match to be claimed after the event.
- 10. Ploughmen who have competed during the day are welcome to have a complimentary tea and cake in the Members Tent or a drink at the bar.

HORSE PLOUGHING RULES

- 1. Turnouts will be judged at 9.30 a.m. prior to ploughing. Best Mare etc. will be judged at work.
- 2. Horses must not be left unattended at any time.
 - Horses must be under full control at all times an assistant to lead is allowed at any stage.
- 3. Competitors to start at end of plot as indicated by Class sign and be ready to start at **10.00am** and finished by **3.00pm**.
- 4. Three siting poles only to be used. The openings will not be judged.
- 5. The crown is to comprise of 8 full furrows after which the Competitor must cast to the next highest number. The last furrow must be thrown to the Competitor's own crown.
- 6. All adjustments to the plough must be carried out by the Competitor.
- 7. Except for the start and finish all ploughing must be carried out to a minimum depth of **5 inches**.
 - There is to be **no handling** of the work, other than the scratches in Class 1.
- 15 minutes will be allowed for a cast-off mark to be made.
 Time will be allowed for a genuine breakdown or, waiting for ones neighbour, if reported to the Steward immediately.
- 9. Any objections must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the completion and accompanied by £5 which will be forfeited if the objection is not substantiated.

RULES FOR TRACTOR PLOUGHING

- Competitors must all start from the same end as indicated by the class signs. Three sighting poles
 only may be used. All competitors will make a split, except Class 4, after which they must wait
 until it has been judged, <u>except</u> on grassland, where the opening will not be judged
 except for Class 5.
- 2. No ploughing to be carried out on the headlands. Stones and trash may only be cleared away by the competitor on that plot.
- 3. Vintage Ploughs: The bodies fitted must have been designed for the plough at the time of manufacture. Modified shares, adjustable stays, extended axles and quick entry top links are allowed. Two-piece mouldboard extensions, hydraulic top links and draw bars are not allowed. Classic Ploughs: As per Vintage Ploughs except that two piece mouldboard extensions are permitted.
- 4. Skims, mouldboard extensions and weights are the only attachments allowed except for Class 4.
- Reversible Ploughs: Opening single furrow opening with right-hand bodies
 Start to consist of 3 runs, after which ploughing must be to the next higher plot number
 Finish to consist of 15 or 16 furrows
 Alternate bodies to be used at all times.
- 6. Time will be allowed for a genuine breakdown or waiting upon ones neighbour if reported to the Steward immediately. Penalty points maybe incurred should the opening not be completed within 20 minutes of the start time.
- 7. The start shall comprise of: for Class 3, six furrows; for two furrow ploughs 11 or 12 furrows and for three or more furrows, 3 times round the split after which all competitors cast to the higher number.
- 8. Minimum furrow width 10" except for Classes 3, 4 and 5. Ploughs with hydraulic vari-width must have the pipes disconnected after the start. After the start all ploughing must be carried out within a minimum depth of 5" and a maximum depth of 7".
- 9. No rolling allowed. A penalty of 10 points may be incurred should the ploughing be handled after being turned by the plough. All adjustments must be carried out by the competitor.
- 10 The last furrow must be thrown towards competitors own crown.
- 11 Tractors to carry only one person at any time on the match site. Penalty will be disqualification.
- 12. Any objections to be made in writing within 30 minutes of completion of class accompanied by £5 which will be forfeited if objection is not substantiated. If any dispute should arise the Committee's decision is final.
